Recent fatal accidents investigated

Two Jackson County men died last weekend in separate singlevehicle accidents.

Drew Douglas Scott, 20, of Monmouth died in a mishap that occurred at about 3:45 a.m. Sunday, April 5, on Iowa 136 near Wyoming.

Ryan Richard Garien, 26, of Maquoketa died in an accident that occurred at 5:26 p.m. Sunday on county road D-61 near Otter Creek.

Jones County sheriff's deputies said Scott was driving on 136 one mile south of Wyoming when his vehicle ran off the highway, striking a utility pole and rolling onto

Scott was pronounced dead at the scene.

Deputies were assisted at the scene by the Midland ambulance, Oxford Junction ambulance and Wyoming Volunteer Fire Department.

Investigation into the accident is continuing, deputies said.

A funeral service for Scott will be held at 10:30 a.m. Thursday, April 9, at Faith Community Church in Maquoketa.

A memorial service also will be held at 2 p.m. Friday, April 10, at the Colfax Center Presbyterian church in Holland, Iowa, where Scott formerly lived and where his

parents, Lee and Janet Scott, reside. Garien was a passenger in a car

being driven west on D-61, the Bellevue-Cascade Road, by Donald James McLaughlin, 27, of rural Maquoketa, according to Jackson County sheriff's deputies.

McLaughlin failed to negotiate a curve to the left 1.7 miles west of the junction of D-61 and U.S. 61 at Otter Creek. The location is 13 miles north of Maquoketa.

The car drove off the right side of the highway and overturned several times, coming to rest on its top, deputies said.

Both front wheels were separated from the car and numerous parts

Garien, who was not wearing a seat belt, was thrown from the

He was pronounced dead at the scene by Dr. Brent Pauls, a deputy Jackson County medical examiner.

McLaughlin, who was wearing a seat belt, was trapped inside the vehicle. He was extricated by the LaMotte Rescue Squad.

McLaughlin received major injuries. He was transported by Jackson County Regional Health Center ambulance to Mercy Medical Center in Dubuque.

McLaughlin's 2001 Lincoln LS was listed as a total loss.

Damage to a fence owned by Carlos and Mary Foust of rural Zwingle was estimated at \$2,000.

Investigation into that accident also is continuing, deputies said. Possible charges against McLaughlin are pending.

Deputies were assisted at the scene by the Iowa State Patrol.

Funeral arrangements for Garien are pending at Carson & Son Funeral and Cremation Services in Maquoketa.

The accident involving Garien marked Jackson County's first traffic fatality of 2009 and the county's first fatality in more than 10 months.

Second reading of water, sewer rate hike passes

An increase in water and sewer rates for Maquoketans moved a step closer to approval this week when the City Council passed the second reading of a pair of ordinances that would enact the

The proposed ordinances would hike water and sewer rates by 1 1/2 percent each year over the next

The first increase would take effect July 1 of this year. Each subsequent increase would begin on July 1 of subsequent years.

The increases would amount to 7 1/2 percent after the fifth and final rate hike would take effect in July

The council on Monday night, April 6, passed the second reading of the ordinances. The council will consider the third and final reading of the ordinances at its next meeting on April 20.

The measures have drawn no opposition from the public and little discussion by the council.

The council's Utilities Committee recommended last month that a series of small yearly rate increases be enacted to avoid having to increase rates by a larger amount in the future.

Committee members noted that the Maquoketa Municipal Electric Utility has received numerous protests of a rate increase of about 25 percent that took effect Jan. 1.

A 1 1/2 percent increase in both water and sewer rates would increase the monthly bill of a typi-
