

Andrew teachers rewarded with funds

Current school district budgets don't leave teachers much in the way of a discretionary budget. Teachers spend an estimated average of \$500 per year out of their own pockets to purchase classroom supplies not provided for in the school budget.

To reward those selflessness deeds, Walmart and Sam's Club launched the Teacher Rewards program. And this year, Andrew Community School District teachers benefited.

Paving project options considered

The Jackson County Board of Supervisors said last week it would work with residents of a rural subdivision north of Bellevue on a paving project.

The supervisors discussed the project on Oct. 5 with Mike Roth, who had submitted a petition to the supervisors two weeks earlier.

The residents are seeking to have a 900-foot portion of 308th Street between U.S. 52 and 381st Avenue hard-surfaced.

Roth said he brought the project to the supervisors' attention after a traffic count done by the Iowa Department of Transportation showed the road carried approximately 280 vehicles per day.

The supervisors said that while the traffic count would qualify the road for hard-surfacing, the county lacks the funds to do so.

"We realize that the number of cars on there qualifies it for paving and it will be cheaper to maintain once it's paved. It's just getting the dollars to do that," said

Supervisor Larry "Buck" Koos.

Roth asked the supervisors about the possibility of including the road on the county's five-year road improvement plan.

Supervisors said they would consider that option. They added, however, that a way to get the paving sooner, even if the road were placed on the five-year plan, would be to work out a cost-share plan in which the county would pay a portion of the cost and affected property owners would pay a portion through special assessments.

"That way you could maybe get it done in a couple years instead of five years," Supervisor Steve Flynn told Roth.

"It would make it easier to fund and make it work in Clark's budget," he added, referring to county Engineer Clark Schloz.

Schloz noted that during his tenure the county has done a couple of other small paving projects.
