and there was no guarantee the city would receive the grant.

Meanwhile, the present truck would continue to cost the department money in repairs, firefighters noted.

The committee agreed and recommended that the city finance the entire purchase and abandon the grant application.

Schwenker also suggested that the city do away with having separate funds to replace each piece of equipment and instead have one large fund out of which all fire truck purchases would

be made.

The committee also agreed to study that proposal separately when the council considers the overall budget.

Councilman Neil Morehead expressed concern at Monday's council meeting that the bidding process was handled properly.

At his urging, the council unanimously approved purchase of the truck on condition that city Attorney Ken Wright approve of the bidding

Frantzen featured in exhibit celebrating American artists

Artist Rose Frantzen's artwork "The Silence That Follows" is featured as an Invitational artist in "Inspiring Figures: An Exhibit Celebrating American Women in Figurative Art."

The exhibition is on display through Oct. 31 at the Butler Institute of American Art in Youngstown, Ohio. The institute holds the distinction of being the first museum in the world to focus exclusively on American art. The National Endowment for the Arts has awarded a \$30,000 Access to Artistic Excellence grant in support of the educational activities and catalog for the exhibition.

Inspiring Figures explores the distinctive influence of female artists and their continued importance in the development of American figurative art and
